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## Free English Language Skills Website Helps People Around the World

The Sacramento County Office of Education (<u>SCOE</u>) is proud to announce that <u>USA</u> <u>Learns</u>, an online interactive English language learning site created by SCOE, will be honored at the 33rd Annual Golden Bell Awards program of the California School Boards Association (<u>CSBA</u>).

"U.S.A. Learns is helping people all over the world to improve their English language skills," said <u>Sacramento County Superintendent of Schools</u> David W. Gordon. "This remarkable website is having a positive impact on adult literacy for English learners."

Learners can use U.S.A. Learns in an independent mode, registered or unregistered, or it can be used under the auspices of a tutor or teacher. The potential learner might work from home, a public library, or a workplace setting. All instructional materials are accessed online.

"We launched U.S.A. Learns in November 2008 and since then the program has been used by nearly 3.8 million learners, two-thirds of them from the United States," said John Fleischman, SCOE Assistant Superintendent of Technology Services. "Its popularity and the loyalty of learners are powerful testimony for both the need and the appeal of using the Web to provide English language instruction."
